WHAT IS SPECIAL EDUCATION?

Special Education is the educational provision for children whose levels of functioning deviate from the norm such that special programmes are necessary to facilitate or foster optimum learning.

THE SPECIAL EDUCATION UNIT

The core Unit was established in the Ministry of Education in January 1989. It is headed by an Assistant Chief Education Officer & has a compliment of seven Education Officers, an administrative assistant, a secretary and a graphic technician. The Unit also includes the positions of Regional Special Needs Coordinators (RSNCOs) and Student Support Teams (SSTs) which are assigned to each of the seven Regions. The Unit operates a Braille & Large Print Programme which provides support to students at the primary level who are blind and visually impaired, through the reproduction of all national examinations and primary curriculum support materials in alternative formats of braille & large print.

OBJECTIVES

- To secure learning opportunities for students with special educational needs & disabilities throughout the education system.
- To plan, implement and monitor Special Education programmes and services.
- To secure access, equity and quality education for students with special educational needs & disabilities.

ROLES AND FUNCTIONS

The Unit provides technical support, curriculum supervision and monitoring services for Government owned, Government-aided & Non-Government special education schools, units & programmes, organizations & community -based facilities island wide. The Unit also engages in assessment, programme planning & interventions & provides sensitization & training on special education matters.

The Unit facilitates the processes of placement, the provision of shadow support & the provision of examination accommodations for students with diagnosed special educational needs and disabilities.

The Unit is a resource base for expertise, advice and hands-on information across all levels of the education system and collaborates with all other units within the MoEY as well as with other Ministries, agencies and other stakeholders which offer services to persons with special needs.
